Conservatorship

Under a sole managing conservatorship, the rights and duties listed below are almost always EXCLUSIVELY granted to one parent (the sole Managing Conservator). This designation does not impact possession and access/child support/health insurance reimbursement. Please make an election.

Rights and Duties

The following rights and duties can be (1) granted EXCLUSIVELY to one party; (2) granted INDEPENDENTLY to each party; (3) require the joint AGREEMENT of both parties; or (4) granted to one party after that party consults with the other party. Please place a 1, 2,3 or 4 by each Right and Duty to indicate your election. If 1 or 4 is written, please indicate which parent is granted that right. If 3 is written, please indicate whether you would like to include a tie-breaker.

The _____ right to consent to medical, dental and surgical treatment involving invasive procedures.

Tie Breaker: Should the parties be unable to agree, the child's current pediatrician shall be the tie breaker.
The right to consent to psychiatric and psychological treatment of the children.
The to represent the children in legal action and to make other decisions of substantial legal significance concerning the children.
The right to consent to marriage and to enlistment in the armed forces of the United States.
The right to make decisions concerning the children's education.
Tie Breaker: Should the parties be unable to agree, the child's school principal (if the child is school age) or if the child is not school age the child's treating physician shall be the tie breaker.
Except as provided by section 264.0111 of the Texas Family Code, the right to the services and earnings of the children.
Except when a guardian of the children's estate or a guardian or attorney ad litem has been appointed for the children, the right to act as an agent of the children in relation to the children's estate if the children's action is required by a state, the United States, or a foreign government.
The right to manage the estate of the children to the extent the estate has been created by the community property or the joint property of the parents.
The following right will need to be granted EXCLUSIVELY to one parent unless the parties are agreeing to a 50/50 possession schedule and reserving that right to the Court. If you are in agreement with a 50/50 possession schedule, you may still grant one parent this right exclusively or you may want to reserve this right to the Court. The geographical boundary established most often in my experience is the county of residence and then all counties contiguous to that county. The person who is designated to determine the residence of the child will have to live in that boundary until and unless at the time they want to move, the other parent conservator is not living within that same boundary so designated. Upon that occurrence, the party granted the exclusive right to determine the residence is no longer restricted to any geographical boundary. On a 50/50 possession schedule, Courts want to see the parents living VERY close to each other (usually within the same ISD) and such a boundary will need to be established and both parents will be required to live within that boundary.
